You may also use trains to reach Proserpine. Tourists preferring to travel via road can use Greyhound and Premier Coaches, which have a stopover at Airlie. You may even book tours for traveling up Australia's East Coast, many of which will take you to visit Airlie Beach.

Things to do

During your Airlie Beach vacation, the best way to relax is to swim in the manmade lagoons, which offer a fantastic view and have life guards positioned during the day and proper security at night to help you make the most of it. These lagoons are usually fifty meters wide and two hundred meters long, come landscaped with a bridge, and have grasses on their surroundings to let you relax by lying and enjoying the sun.

Though you can also go for a swim at the beaches near the near Shute Harbor Road, make sure to wear a stinger suit, which will keep you protected from being stung by a jellyfish.

If you are lucky to have a Saturday morning during your Airlie Beach vacation, you can pick a few souvenirs like local arts and crafts, and buy some locally produced foods from the charming market at the waterfront where sellers makes brisk business.

If you have a bike or a car, you may even make a trip to the Cedar Creek Falls, which will take about 20 minutes.

Airlie Beach has other activities to keep you hooked as well like quad biking, waterskiing, jet skiing, horse riding and parasailing – just to name a few. You may even take a 5 minutes drive from the beach to reach places that offer facilities to play tennis, lawn bowls and golf.
